During the [webinar on December 17](#), Mr. Hunter will provide an introduction to careers in intelligence analysis, including a discussion of counterterrorism, human factors in terrorism, weapons systems, detainee support, Homeland Security, and counterdrug intelligence. He will also offer a breakdown of the different agencies and their missions, including the DIA, and explain the "need-to-know" process (along
