From the resurgence of Taliban militants in Pakistan to the presence of al-Qa'ida sympathizers and supporters in strategic theaters of conflict, what does the future hold for stability in the Afghanistan/Pakistan region?

What strategies are most effective to combat insurgencies? What role do Special Forces and intelligence operations have on the contested battlefields of Afghanistan and possibly Pakistan? What regional policies need to be developed, refined, and implemented to tackle the increasingly complex strategic security environment across the South Asian landscape and the greater Middle East?

Authors from around the globe are invited to share their perspectives on these and other strategic security issues – *your creativity and unique perspective are welcome.*

Who Should Submit?

We welcome submissions from students, practitioners, scholars, and experts from the intelligence, military, and law enforcement communities, as well as from government, academia, and the private sector. *If you have a proposal for a paper or a completed article, please submit it for consideration according to the instructions below.*

Submission Guidelines

Articles should be from 1,500 to 3,000 words. Occasionally, we print longer pieces (3,500-5,000 words) and shorter pieces (750 or more words) depending on the context. Regardless of length, writers submitting an article or proposal should include the following with their submission:

- Contact information

- A bio (150 words or less) summarizing the writer's background and expertise
- Any graphics or images that you'd like considered for inclusion with your article
- If available, a list of your most recent publications

Format

Please submit all documents via e-mail attachment in Microsoft Word. No hard copy submissions will be accepted. Submitted articles should be in 12 pt. Times New Roman font, single-spaced. Margins should be 1" inch or 72 pts all around.

Annotations

To receive full consideration for publication, all submissions must be fully cited using footnotes that include, if applicable, the URL of online sources. Authors will be required to re-submit their submissions if they are not in the proper format.

No bibliography is required.

All manuscripts must follow the *Chicago Manual* (15th edition) humanities (N) format and style, available at:

Review Process

All articles that are initially accepted for publication are subject to peer review. The author may be asked to make changes as requested by the reviewer and editor before the work is published. Only original manuscripts not previously published or under

consideration for publication elsewhere will be considered. If accepted for publication, all manuscripts become the exclusive property of *JSS*, and cannot be published elsewhere without the written consent of Henley-Putnam University.
